Dangerous incident IncNot0040846 Underground coal mine  Ground or strata	A coal burst occurred while a longwall was in full remote operation. The workers were operating from the maingate as per their coal burst TARP. 	Identification of increased coal burst potential and properly implemented TARPs reduces the likelihood of a coal burst exposing workers to risk. TARPs should be continually reviewed to ensure that the triggers and controls remain appropriate as mining conditions evolve. Health and Safety Executive (UK)	<p>Preventing inrushes at underground mines – Safety Bulletin (HID 4-2011)</p> <p>The inrush of water and material at Gleision Mine in South Wales which resulted in the deaths of four miners almost 10 years ago, is a tragic reminder of the major hazard potential of uncontrolled inflows to mine workings.</p> <p>Details</p>

WorkSafe (Queensland)	<p>Worker fatally crushed after being hit by moving vehicle</p> <p>In August 2021, a worker was fatally injured when he was crushed between his truck and a concrete column. Investigations are continuing into the exact cause.</p> <p>Details</p>
