## **Executive Summary**

#### Overview

This report provides a summary of the performance for the provision of title assessments and processing within the NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment's Division of Resources and Geoscience (the Division) for Quarter 3 2019 (1 July 2019 to 30 September 2019).

The Division's performance is reported against the Service Delivery Standards, which note target timeframes for the processing of applications under the *Mining Act 1992*. These are published by the Division at:

## Processing timeframes

Processing timeframes for title applications and renewals commence when a complete application, including all supporting information, is received. If an application is deficient, the applicant is notified and given 10 business days to submit all requirement supporting information. Processing timeframes end when the applicant is notified of the proposed decision for the application.

Processing timeframes for security deposit releases commence when a determination is made on the release of a security deposit and end when the refund request is sent to the Department's finance team.

Exception management (stop-the-clock) protocols apply when circumstances beyond the control of the Division's process prevent the valid assessment of an application. More information on exception management can be found at:

### Subsidence management plan approvals

On 18 September 2019, the function of subsidence management plan approvals was transferred from the Division to the NSW Resources Regulator. This includes adopting the 90-day key performance indicator and reporting on it annually. Therefore, from quarter 4 2019, subsidence management plan approvals will not be reported in Division's quarterly performance reports.

### **Quarter 3 2019**

#### Performance overview




Figure 1 Q3 2019 service delivery standard performance

This following chart (Figure 1) details performance of proposed decisions, security deposit releases and subsidence management plan approvals, as measured against the Service Delivery Standards published by the Division for Quarter 3 2019 (Q3). During this quarter, **112** notifications of proposed decisions, security deposit releases and subsidence management plan approvals were issued. Of these, **91 per cent** met the target timeframe.



#### Breakdown of submission timeframes

The following chart (Figure 2) details the timeframe in which matters were submitted for the proposed decision/security releases/subsidence management plan approvals in Q3 2019.

Of the total 112 proposed decisions/security releases/approvals in Q3 2019, 99 were submitted in 2019. The remaining 13 proposed decisions were submitted prior to 2019, with one as far back as 2015.

Figure 2 Breakdown of applications/security determinations submitted prior to and in 2019




### Performance by submission timeframe

The following charts (Figures 3 and 4) categorise performance by timeframe (i.e. whether the application was submitted in 2019 or prior).

Of the 112 proposed decisions/security releases/approvals in Q3 2019:


- 99 were submitted in 2019, with **99 per cent** meeting the target timeframe.
- 13 were submitted prior to 2019, with 31 per cent meeting the target timeframe.

## Applications received

For Q3 2019, there were 118 applications received, compared to 87 for the same period last year (Table 2).

On average, there were approximately 99 applications received per quarter during the period 1 July 2018 to 30 September 2019.
