Application fee schedule – practising certificates

Payment of the application fee must be made with submission of your <u>completed</u> application in the <u>Regulator Portal</u> for it to be accepted and progressed. The application fee is non-refundable if your application is incomplete, unsuccessful or if you withdraw. Payments can be made through Eventbrite at the links below. (**Note:** your financial institution for payment may charge you costs in addition to those listed below)
