Question 1

You are the deputy in a main headings development panel with six headings. The panel is set up with two continuous miners, three shuttle cars and ventilated by two auxiliary fans. During a production shift, there is a gas ignition at one of the continuous miners that is being assisted by two shuttle cars at the time of the incident. The heading is approximately 25 m from the cut through.

- a) Explain your immediate actions after the ignition. (10 marks)
- b) Explain what activities would be done, if any, with the other continuous miner. (5 marks)
- c) What could have been the reasons for the gas ignition? (5 marks)

Question 2

On the plan provided of a five heading development panel show the following:

- a) The proposed production sequence to form the next pillar. (4 marks)
- b) The location of all face machinery and equipment. (6 marks)
- c) Ventilation readings at the start of the panel, at the last line of cut throughs, at the production face and the return or returns. (4 marks)
- d) Mark the location of the hazardous zone. (2 marks)
- e) Explain what the mining conditions are in the panel to justify your answers. (4 marks)

Question 3

List the following notifiable incidents:

- a) Dangerous incident (10 marks)
- b) Serious injuries or illness (10 marks)

Question 4

You are the deputy in a longwall panel that is on a planned maintenance shift.

The seam is very gassy where the tailgate gas reading is rarely under 1.25%.

The planned work in the tailgate includes the use of a diesel machine.


- a) To allow access for the diesel machine into the tailgate it is planned to have a 'ventilation reversal'. Explain what would be carried out in this planned work. (10 marks)
- b) Explain with the aid of a sketch how gas is controlled in the tailgate using a brattice wing. (10 marks)

Question 5

You are the deputy in a 'place change/cut flit' production panel.

- a) List the six top hazards. (8 marks)
- b) Explain how each hazard is controlled. (12 marks)
